Group Leader Application Packet

Thank you for your interest in leading a LEAPNOW international travel adventure. We've run more than sixty 3-month group travel programs since our first group in 1999. We currently run four LEAPYEAR groups every Fall to Asia and Latin America, One Revolution groups both Fall and Spring to Guatemala, India and Uganda, and this Fall we are piloting the Ring of Fire group program in Latin America.

We are one of the few education and travel organizations that equally emphasize the importance of the inner and outer journeys. This reflects our intention to run programs that are truly transformative for the participant – thus staying on the cutting edge of human evolution.

We believe real exploration in the world is preferable to sixteen uninterrupted years in a classroom; our traditional educational system is information-rich but experience poor. We value the opportunity to expand our world through travel and exposure to other cultures. LEAPNOW's organizational mission is focused on the emerging shift in global consciousness: we aim to help students recognize the limitations of the current power structure and begin to realize the world's fundamental unity and interdependent wholeness. We understand as an organization that this shift is critical to the survival of our species on the planet. We no longer have time to merely give people a nice travel experience.

To this end, the LEAPNOW model starts with building a foundation of integrity, conscious communication and the creation of clear and uplifting group agreements. The diverse experiences of travel, work and study in a "foreign" region and culture create an opening for a shift of consciousness to occur. Conscious and well-trained leader teams help this opening to blossom into a "raising of the eyes" of our students.

LEAPYEAR is a 9-month first year of college that starts with a semester of guided group travel in Latin America or Asia. The second semester is highlighted by a 12-week internship representing the engaged and active fulfillment of the individual student's unique interests. LEAPYEAR groups spend 8 weeks in retreats at our northern California campus learning the skills needed to live life in integrity with oneself, to create conscious community, to vision and re-vision one's life-path, to practice daily awareness, and to cook, create clothing, and complete construction projects. Participants earn a full year of college credit through this series of international and inner challenges.

One Revolution is a group program of travel and service in Central America, Asia and Africa. During both Fall and Spring semesters, a group of people ages 17 and older will travel together around the world and do three 5-week periods of volunteer service: in Guatemala, India and Uganda. The program is bound together with three contemplative retreats that allow the inner growth to keep pace with the dramatic outer journey. This program brings together diverse group travel to three continents, individual internships, the inner journey, and the possibility of academic credit.

Ring of Fire is a program devoted to the inner exploration of the journey to manhood. Both Fall and Spring a group of 8-12 young men will travel Central and South America along the Ring of Fire, a chain of volcanoes that encircles most of the Pacific Ocean. Along the way, the group will take on physical and emotional challenges and spend significant time giving and learning, providing then a dynamic springboard into powerful and life-affirming manhood. The program incorporates three contemplative retreats and culminates in a 5-day Rite of Passage upon return to California.

LEAPNOW provides its leaders with an intensive leadership training prior to the start of each group semester to immerse our leaders in the vocabulary and process of the inner journey they will be guiding the students through, as well as the logistics of the outer journey of the group travel semester. Past leaders have described this training as a transformational growth and leadership workshop. The training is where you forge a strong leader team prior to meeting and traveling with the group.



Leader Benefits:

- Pay: Trip leader pay starts at \$2500 for a 3-month contract. We give preference to leaders that are able to lead multiple semesters.
- Room, board, international airfare and all non-personal expenses are paid.
- Intensive experiential leader training with expenses paid.
- \$300 travel stipend to get to and from California for training and at the end of the semester.
- International Medical Insurance for the duration of your program.

Leader Responsibilities/Job Description:

- Maintain the safety and well-being of a group of up to 12 young adults ages 17 and older traveling abroad.
- Create a fun & nurturing educational environment
- Promote individual learning of students
- Coordinate and direct logistics of your semester
- Maintain relationships with sponsors abroad
- Manage a spending plan while traveling
- Enforce program rules and expectations
- Facilitate cohesive group dynamics and build community
- Solve problems creatively in response to constantly changing situations
- Maintain communication with headquarters in California

Minimum Leader Qualifications:

- Minimum age of 25.
- Proficiency in Spanish for trips to Central and South America (can you negotiate a medical emergency in Spanish and take a student to the doctor and explain everything that needs to be communicated?).
- Direct experience living or traveling in the relevant geographic region.
- Current certification in Wilderness First Aid prior to departure (usually a 2-3 day course).
- Prior experience leading groups.

Qualities: We are looking for the following in our leaders:

- A strong desire to positively affect another human being's life.
- Enjoyment of the challenge of working with young first-time travelers.
- Experience working with teens and young adults.
- Active engagement in personal growth and development.
- Flexibility and ability to perform well under constantly changing environments.
- Ability to be a good mentor.
- Excellent organizational skills and well developed communication skills.
- Ability to establish clear guidelines and boundaries and assist others in honoring them.
- Skill in resolving issues and solving problems.
- Enjoyment of being a resource for other people.
- Comfortable being available to students during travel times 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Comfortable with confronting negative behavior.
- Demonstrated ability to travel independently and possessing in-depth experience in relevant regions.
