We live in a time that many people are calling "The Great Turning" - a time that requires the people of planet Earth to make a shift from a focus on industrial growth to the sustaining of life. The continuation of human life on the planet requires this shift - and there is an urgency to evolve that humans haven't felt before.

To be part of the change, we each need to learn skills and new ways of thinking that support the long-term viability and sustainability of life on the planet, while unlearning ways that lead to the degradation of the planet.

One Revolution is a 16-week opportunity to be exposed to people and projects on three continents that are working for this change - learning from them, experiencing diverse cultural settings, and gaining an invaluable perspective on the state of the planet as a whole. In the process of learning and doing on 3 continents we will learn about the three levels of change that are needed:

1. Holding actions: to preserve species, individuals, ecosystems, cultures, languages.
2. The creation of new structures and ways of organizing.
3. Shifts in consciousness that deeply root these new structures.

One Revolution is an ideal gap year program because it gives you an overview of the whole planet by exposing you deeply to life on three continents (not including North America!), and gives you a glimpse into the future through action in the present - giving you the broad perspective you need to create a life of learning and meaningful engagement with the issues of our time. During our travels in Latin America, India & Africa each One Revolution group engages with projects that expose them to:

- Permaculture, Organic Agriculture, Composting
- Green Building, Earth Building
- Intentional Communities, Zero Waste Communities
- Reforestation, Environmental Repair, Water Issues, Appropriate Technologies, Ecotourism
- Social Justice, Poverty, Street Children, Women's Issues
- Microfinance, Worker's Co-ops, Free Trade
- Educational Alternatives, Un-schooling, Education for Empowerment

The One Revolution learning adventure gives you a chance to dive into many of the world's leading sustainable development movements that are helping millions of people across the globe positively change their realities. From harvesting coffee beans and bananas at a Fair-Trade community cooperative to building a "green school" with recycled tires and garbage, there are many significant ways to positively impact the world. You will not only be working with and learning from experts in these methodologies, but also directly participating in projects that are transforming communities in need. By getting exposure to a variety of cutting-edge sustainable movements, you will have the chance to discover what sparks your curiosity and defines your passion.

One Revolution is designed to be an extended active meditation and inquiry into how you can “be the change that you wish to see in the world.” The variety of cultures and social structures in these three very diverse regions of the world will ask you to examine your potential in the world, and how you might like to realize it; to reflect on and integrate these extremely diverse experiences into your life. Each country and every project gives you the opportunity to experience yourself in very different ways – providing a series of valuable mirrors to you.

Each major transition in the program is introduced and buffered by a retreat - three at the LEAPNOW campus in California, and one in India. These give participants time to get oriented and learn vital skills (conscious communication, group agreements, transitions), to take a breath and realize how much they have experienced in each phase of the program. The first retreat will help you prepare for the journey, and give the group time to come together prior to traveling. The second and third retreats (in California after Nicaragua, then between India and Africa) give time to digest each leg of the journey, and the final retreat back in the U.S. gives time to harvest your learning, take time to digest your experiences, and connect each internship experience to your individual life purpose.

There isn't anything else out there like this journey. We look forward to accompanying you on a spectacular journey for one full revolution around this precious planet!

# PROGRAM OVERVIEW AND CALENDAR

## One Revolution Dates Spring 2012:

<i>February 21 – 24:</i>	Retreat in California at the LEAPNOW campus
<i>February 25 – March 25:</i>	Nicaragua: Spanish – Homestay – Projects - Internships
<i>March 26 – 29:</i>	Retreat at the LEAPNOW Campus
<i>March 30 - May 3:</i>	India: Projects and Internships (Retreat 3 in India)
<i>May 4 - June 5:</i>	East Africa: Biointensive Study & Project
<i>June 5 - 8:</i>	Retreat in California at the LEAPNOW campus

While traveling abroad, One Revolution students stay at homestays, hostels and local guesthouses, and live as the locals do. This is generally simple, but not primitive – most of the time we have a bed to sleep in and running water. Food is basic, and there are the inherent primary challenges of culture shock, cold, heat, fellow group members, rain and bugs.

**Retreat 1:** A 4-day retreat at the LEAPNOW Campus in Northern California doing basic orientation to the program, meeting your group members and leaders, and creating a healthy foundation for a conscious traveling community. Orientation includes a cultural introduction to Central America, health and safety education, and basic traveling skills.

**Nicaragua:** We start with an orientation in the Granada, one of the oldest cities in Central America, followed by 10 days volunteering on the island of Ometepe in the middle of Lake Nicaragua with an organization focused on using sustainable farming and micro-enterprise to help the local community earn sustainable livelihoods and practice environmentally safe agriculture. Then we transition to the highlands of Nicaragua to Jinotega where we will spend volunteering with the La Bastille Technical High School and supporting their initiatives running micro-enterprises and an eco-lodge while living with homestay families. In both locations, the mornings will be spent learning about and working with local organizations and the afternoons will be dedicated to language study and community exchanges. We spend a week at a family-run fair-trade coffee & banana cooperative learning about fair trade coffee and supply chain economics.

**Retreat 2:** Held in California, this 3-day retreat gives us a chance to re-load, while slowing down to digest the experience of Nicaragua, and prepare for travel to India. We receive a cultural introduction to India and revisit health and safety issues as they relate to India.

## **India:**

After flying to India, students and leaders will travel by train to the city of Udaipur to spend several weeks working with an innovative organization dedication to sustainability, alternative education and “unschooling.” This organization offers young Indians a chance use social activism and expression as the driving force in their education – a great opportunity for direct exchange, while assisting them with projects including zero-waste, gift cafés, and many other empowering projects.

Next, the group will visit a more rural area in Rajasthan with an organization that is building solar ovens and other environmentally appropriate technologies. You will explore the rigid social caste system of India, the struggles of those at the bottom, and the innovative ways this organization is helping entire communities create new ways of relating by running multi-caste social justice and women’s microfinance programs.

**Retreat 3:** Time set-aside in India to process our experience, gain exposure to contemplative practice, and prepare together for the final leg of the trip in Kenya and Tanzania in East Africa.

### **East Africa:**

**Kenya:** We spend time at a rural center devoted to improving the living standards of resource-poor communities and promoting self-sustaining food production. Here we will learn about BioIntensive farming, then assist the organization to plant one of its many project gardens in village centers and small schools – thus providing children and families with more nourishing, locally grown foods.

**Tanzania:** We travel by bus to the south of Tanzania to spend our final two weeks with a small organization putting Gandhi’s call to “be the change you wish to see in the world” into practice. An American-led initiative working with the support of the local community, this organization is creating and building a cross-cultural “Living Example Center” aimed at offering a place for both the local community and foreigners to cooperate, peacefully coexist, and mutually benefit from whole-systems health and harmony. The One Revolution group will plan, create and implement a project for the center, putting to use skills learned during the program.

**Final Retreat:** Return to our northern California campus to bring your feet gently back on the ground in the U.S. Here we focus on reflection and mining of the trip for maximum learning, then focus on ways to take your newfound skills and awareness into your post-program life.

# LOGISTICS

- ▶ **APPLICATION & ADMISSIONS:** Interested applicants complete and send in the attached One Revolution Application Form. Once received, a LEAPNOW staff member will contact you for a phone interview. There is no application deadline – we accept people until the program is full – then create a waiting list. We reserve the right to require any applicant to have an in-person interview – though this happens infrequently.
  - Packet I: Acceptance and Registration - Once accepted into a program, participants receive an Acceptance and Registration Packet. This packet includes detailed information on academics, a full program overview, financial details and a tuition agreement.
  - Packet II: Logistics - This second and final packet together with the regularly-updated web page, covers program details, transportation, gear & equipment, health & immunization info, communication during the program and required documents & paperwork.
- ▶ **GROUP SIZE:** A maximum of 12 students with 2 leaders while traveling around the globe. Student:Staff ratio at the U.S. retreats averages ~1:1.
- ▶ **AGE RANGE:** Minimum age is 17 by the start date of the program. There is no upper age limit.
- ▶ **REQUIREMENTS:** Participants must be able to attend the full program. Anyone in reasonable physical condition should be able to complete the program successfully. A vegetarian or restricted diet can be sustained throughout the program.
- ▶ **HEALTH, SAFETY AND COMMUNICATION:** The safety and well being of our students is our first priority. LEAPNOW has safely brought home over 1,700 students after travel all over the world since 1994. The current world situation raises questions for our students, their families and friends, and it is very important that you feel confident and secure as you embark on a program involving international study and travel. We constantly monitor the world situation through the U.S. State Department, and through a network of individual and organizational contacts in the countries we visit that function as our eyes and ears on the ground. We design and modify group travel to avoid hot spots, health risks & political trouble. Students have regular access to phone and email communication throughout the program. Group leaders carry an emergency cell phone at all times.

Our group leaders are experienced both as travelers and leaders, and usually have led a LEAPYEAR group semester for LEAPNOW prior to leading a One Revolution program. Each group of students travels with two leaders to ensure that any individual emergencies can be given the attention needed for resolution. One Revolution starts with a retreat in the U.S. before any travel commences – allowing us to give very comprehensive orientation, get a good sense of each of the participants, and lay down a foundation for healthy group dynamics before leaving the country. Please note that there are short periods during the trip when participants will have limited access to medical attention. Throughout our travels, participants are provided with potable water, clear information about health risks, and in-country orientation about each new place we visit and each new activity.

## ▶ **COLLEGE CREDIT:**

One Revolution participants have the option to earn college credit through a simple and inexpensive process. We have an arrangement with Seattle Central Community College (SCCC) that allows you to earn up to 15-quarter hours of credit for the program. SCCC is accredited through the Northwestern Association of Schools and Colleges (NWASC). The College offers a number of courses designed to allow students to earn academic credit for international study or work experience. The courses don't require you to go to Seattle, and there is no physical classroom. The course meets electronically by email, or by mail, phone or fax. Reading, journaling and writing papers are an integral part of the curriculum. There is a high degree of latitude for you in determining what you would like to study within each course – you can focus on the aspects of the region or culture that are of most interest to you, and it integrates well with the One Revolution experiential curriculum.

### **Courses include:**

- **EDU 291: Using the World as a Classroom (5 or 10 credits)** Research outside the classroom is now a reality. Students pick a travel destination, select a research topic, gather research data, and combine them all into a learning experience. A self-paced course.
- **HUM 291: Language Enhancement through Experiential Activities (5 or 10 credits)** A course for undergraduate students taking advantage of language study opportunities outside the USA, living with a family for total language immersion, or attending a language school while at the same time studying the culture of the country. Students will be expected to complete all course requirements upon their return to the United States.

► **COST:** The ONE REVOLUTION program cost is \$12,900 and includes all scheduled program activities, food and accommodation during the program. Not included in the program fee is the cost of personal health insurance (required), personal spending money, India visa as well as domestic and international airfare. The program fee is paid in full prior to the start of the program in two installments.

**CREATE A FULL GAP YEAR:** Participants can take the opportunity to use the semester-long One Revolution program to start or end a full ‘Gap Year.’ To that end, LEAPNOW offers various semester-long programs & solo internships that can be put together with One Revolution to create a cohesive and comprehensive year of exploration & growth. Solo internships can be found on our website, and short descriptions of our other group programs are provided here:

**Supported Internships:** This three-and-a-half-month Spring or Fall semester program brings together 2 inner-directed residential retreats at the LEAPNOW campus, with a major internship chosen from 6,000+ that are available throughout the world. The program is open to anyone over the age of 18 at the very reasonable cost of \$1,400. Supported Internship semesters can be attended back-to-back or combined with one of our other programs to tailor an amazing year of learning. This is an example of “live education” where the individual’s life purpose is the context for living and learning. Academic credit is available to Supported Internship students.

**Learn to Serve: India:** LEAPNOW accompanies a group of students to live for a semester in Varanasi, India. Students work in service internships, help those who would otherwise not be helped, learn Hindi, and live with Hindu or Muslim families. They supplement their volunteering with yoga, meditation and apprenticeships in arts, crafts, music, cooking, dance & more. Learn to Serve runs spring and fall at the low program cost of \$7,900.

## ONE REVOLUTION PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS & RULES:

For any group of human beings to thrive while living together, basic guidelines of behavior and expectation are needed. The following are the basic non-negotiable rules that govern our community, and that you will have to embrace if you want to be part of it.

1. One Revolution is for those who are willing to challenge themselves physically, culturally and socially. If you are willing to work hard, take on challenges, and make a difference, this is a program for you. If you are looking for a vacation, trip or party, please look elsewhere!
2. We expect all group members to treat one another with basic respect and consideration. One Revolution staff will help group members work through any issues or conflicts that arise during the program.
3. In general, the following behaviors are out-of-bounds, and if you engage in these behaviors and are unable to make positive changes after receiving feedback, you will be asked to leave the One Revolution program: If you engage in behavior that puts **the program** at risk; If you engage in behavior that puts **another group member or leader's** health, safety, or well-being at risk; If you put **your own** health, safety or well-being at risk; or, If your behavior is negatively impacting someone else's experience.
4. I understand that the program is DRUG AND ALCOHOL FREE. Any drug or alcohol use, purchase or possession during the program results in immediate termination. I understand that drug and alcohol use runs counter to the intention of the program, which is to build a high level awareness of self and others. This includes abuse of prescription medication, purchase or possession of drug paraphernalia, and also includes the use of tobacco. I understand that past participants have been asked to leave the program for the above reasons, and that I may be subject to a drug test if I am found behind closed doors where drugs are present. I also understand that if I bring drugs or alcohol at the start of the program I will forfeit any monies paid to the date I am asked to leave.
5. If you create a "mess" during the program, it will be your responsibility to make amends within 48 hours. This must be done without the prompting of the group leaders. A "mess" can be a physical mess, a problem for another group member, host family, leader or program sponsor, or other problem that an adult would clear and clean up – to restore harmony and make amends.
6. The following are not tolerated during the program: unwanted sexual advances, verbal abuse, physical violence, property damage, or theft. If not rectified immediately, each of these may result in the termination of participation in One Revolution.
7. As a general rule, participants are expected to act responsibly. The program leaders are not babysitters or parental surrogates. Their first priorities are your safety, and the viability of the program. You may be asked to leave the program if you put your own, or the group's, or your leaders' safety and well-being in danger.
8. You will need to use more discretion about behavior and dress while traveling abroad than you do in the United States. It is imperative that stay within guidelines given during orientations.
